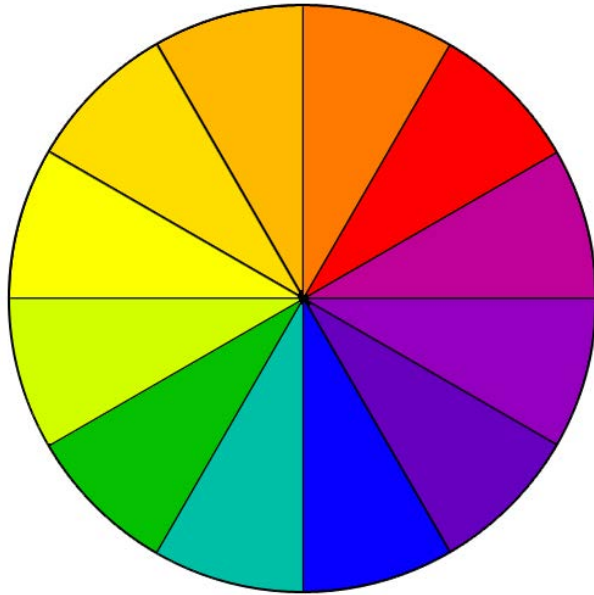

Using Color



Methods:

1. Look through your closet
2. Pick a piece of clothing
3. Use the color wheel to match your outfit

Match your outfits using a color wheel

Monochromatic Color Scheme



You can create a monochromatic color scheme when you pick one color on the color wheel along with two similar colors.

- Examples include **green** pants like the ones above paired with similar colors.

Analogous Color Scheme



You can create an analogous color scheme when you pick three to five colors adjacent to each other on the color wheel and put them together.

- Examples include **blue**, **green** and **black**.

Complementary Color Scheme



You can create a complementary color scheme when you pick two colors directly across from each other on the color wheel.

- Examples include **purple** and **yellow**.

Split-Complementary Color Scheme



You can create a split-complementary color scheme when you pick a color and use two colors adjacent to its complement color.

- Examples include **orange**, **blue** and **red**.

Triad Color Scheme



You can create a triad color scheme when you match three colors that are equally spaced on the color wheel.

- Examples include **blue**, **red** and **yellow**.

Tetrad Color Scheme



You can create a tetrad color scheme when you pick two pairs of complementary colors and put them together.

- Examples include **orange** and **blue**, **purple** and **yellow**.
